JCERT was established by the Human Resource Development Department, Government of Jharkhand, in 2006 and is registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860. It receives financial support from the centrally sponsored scheme of Teacher Education (CSSTE) under Samagra Shiksha and also from the State Government's Annual Grant. JCERT is governed by its General Council (Chairman: Hon. Minister, SE&L Dept.) and Executive Committee (Chairman: Secretary, SE&L Dept.). Other working committees, such as those for Textbook Development, Vetting of Resource Material, e-content development, DIKSHA, Awards, etc., are also constituted within JCERT.
